Importance of monitoring mental health stressed during May

Matters related to mental illness for which Tennesseans should be aware, according to **Volunteer Behavioral Health**, include the fact that depression is the leading cause of disability worldwide; that suicide is a leading cause of death for youth between the ages of 14 and 24; that addiction and substance abuse are considered mental health issues; that 50 percent of all lifetime mental illness cases begin at age 14; and that 60% of adults and 50% of youth (ages 8-15) who suffer with mental illness did not receive treatment during the past year.
