RVBH awarded \$180K grant to expand substance abuse services to homeless population

"We know that substance abuse often co-occurs with mental illness in the homeless population," said Dr. Lionel Phelps, RiverValley's Vice President of Continuous Quality Improvement. "We want to address this issue and break down the obstacles to treatment and recovery. The funding from this grant will allow us to hire additional staff for our Mobile Crisis Team and provide additional technology supports to identify and treat individuals dealing with a substance use disorder who reside in homeless shelters."

Fine to increase mental and behavioral health workforce

SB 3617 focuses on expanding the current workforce. It will accelerate the process for out of state clinicians applying for licensure in Illinois, as well as suspending requirements for social workers, professional counselors, and clinical psychologists with licenses that have been inactive for five years. Additionally, it includes initiatives to support diversity in the mental health field, establishing tax credits, and many more provisions, all of which will encourage more quality, accessible care to those seeking assistance.
