Chronic underfunding of community behavioral health prevents agencies from providing competitive compensation to mental health professionals. Community-based providers dedicate nearly 80 cents of every revenue dollar to salaries and benefits for clinicians and other team members, but we cannot compete with the salaries and benefits available through private practice, large hospital systems, state or federal government programs and even new telehealth-based providers serving clients out of state.

The website provides information about the #BoulderStrong Resource Center (BSRC), including services offered on-site and through MHP’s Moving Beyond Trauma support groups; a section highlighting resources on coping skills, healing from trauma, and cultivating resiliency; information on crisis support; a blog; donation opportunities; and more. To help support these efforts, MHP has also created the “TogetherStrong Fund.” Donations to this fund will help cover programming expenses for the Center’s first year to ensure the community has access to a full array of no-cost services, including ongoing support groups, health and wellness coaching, peer support specialists, access to community health workers.

Mental health services struggled to meet increased demand during pandemic, study finds

The U.S. Government Accountability Office study analyzed data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that found that 27% more adults in the U.S. reported symptoms of anxiety or depression during the pandemic, between April 2020 and February 2021, compared to in 2019. ER visits for drug overdoses increased by 36% and ER visits for suicide attempts rose by 26% in the past year compared to the same time period of the year earlier.

What About Us? The Marginalization of Serious Mental Health and Substance Use

In response to this neglect of the mental health workforce in vaccine allocation schemas, the National Association of State Mental Health Program Directors, the National Council of Behavioral Health, and the National **Mental Health Corporations of America** wrote to Robert R. Redfield Jr, MD, then the CDC director, prior to the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices issuance of its allocation framework. The mental health organizations argued that mental health practitioners “should be categorized as frontline providers, therefore making them eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccine in its earliest phase of distribution.”²⁵
