Frontier Heath receives \$424K to expanding school-based mental services

The Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (TDMHSAS) has selected a total of ten programs across the state to receive \$6.5 million in new funding to expand mental health services for children and youth. Other grant recipients included **McNabb Center**, which received \$1.1M for Creating three Crisis Response Teams which will partner with schools, East Tennessee Children's Hospital, and detention centers to improve outcomes from a child's mental health crisis.

Prehospital emergent pediatric behavioral health incidents increase by 40% in 2021 for some ages, suicides and self-harm incidents account for 25% of these incidents

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) reported the proportion of pediatric mental health-related emergency department visits increased by 31% from 2019 to 2020. The ImageTrend Collaborate Dataset showed increases in prehospital incidents based on region (9%-27%) and age groups (2%-40%), but most concerning was the proportion of suicide and self-harm incidents (25%) amongst pediatric behavioral health incidents.
